Dear parents and carers,

I am incredibly proud to be Headteacher at Lady Bay Primary School and genuinely cannot wait to welcome all the children back in September.

September

Along with this newsletter, I have attached our school's contingency plan for home learning for a range of scenarios. This covers what will happen with home learning if an individual child needs to be sent home, if a year group bubble needs to be sent home or if there is a local or national lockdown. I have had a variety of feedback during this time, mostly positive and in support of school and some with constructive ways we can improve the support we give. We have tried to take this on board when creating the plan.

Catch up

We are in the process or writing our catch up action plans for September. We have been informed that the school will receive funding which equates to £80 per child. To give you an indication of what this could fund – it would roughly equate to each child receiving 4 hours 1-1 TA support. Although it is great to have extra funding, we are aware some children will need more than this. We are trying to think as creatively as possible on how to use this funding and have a range of ideas already. I will hopefully be able to share more about this in September.

PE

We are asking for children to bring a PE kit in a drawstring bag in September. This can stay in school for a half term and be taken to be washed during the holiday.

Bags

Please do not buy new rucksacks for the children to bring to school in September. They will only be able to bring a book bag and a drawstring PE bag. This is to ensure we limit the amount of unnecessary items in the classroom and, as the desk now have to be forward facing, we do not have the space to have rucksacks for each child.

Assemblies

Assemblies will change slightly in September. Mrs. Keane and I lead an assembly for the children each week (in year groups). The staff will be leading one in their classroom. These will be either from our Jigsaw topic or a different theme we want to share with the children. 2 will be based around books and the final one will be a celebration assembly in their classrooms. This will be the format until we are able to have more children in the hall together.

RSE

As you will no doubt be aware, relationship and sex education is statutory from September 2020. We have decided to invest in a scheme called Jigsaw. This scheme which will ensure all staff cover the statutory requirements and it also has a mental health and wellbeing section in every lesson. Our new policy is on the website if you would like to find further information. We are all very exciting to be sharing this within our new curriculum offering.

Curriculum

We are incredibly excited to show the amazing changes we have made to our curriculum. We will be teaching a truly broad and a balanced curriculum with our values and global citizenship at its core. At the end of term, all long term plans will be uploaded on the website. Additionally, as the year progresses you will be able to see the prominence of all subjects increasing on the website.

Breakfast club

Just a quick reminder about Breakfast club...

We are aiming to open breakfast club on Monday 7th September. We will have 1 table per year group (7 tables) and children will need to sit at their year group table. This includes siblings. We are able to have a maximum of 10 children per table, so the maximum children who will be able to attend is 70. We would ask you to please book in advance because as soon as the 10 spaces are filled, we will not be able to have any other children from that year group. The club remains at £5 and will continue to be open from 7.30.

Thanks to all the parents who have collected reports and books this week. If you couldn't make you allotted slot, there is a catch up one between 10 and 11 on Friday. Unfortunately, we are not able to store any books left after this point. Any reports which are not collected will be sent in the post.
